

As you may know from the news, national supply-chain shortages of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) are affecting hospitals across the country during the novel coronavirus pandemic. Although UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland is not out of PPE at this time, we have identified isolation gowns as an item we'd like to increase in our supplies. Our hospital staff use 500-600 isolation gowns per day in delivering world-class care to our babies and children. We truly appreciate your creative energy and effort in supporting us.

Isolation gown sewing pattern. Isolation gowns are used in the health care industry for the protection of the healthcare workers and their patients.

This pattern is available for free from the vendor.

The gowns should meet the following criteria to optimally protect our staff:

- **The gowns should be made from cotton or cotton/polyester blend woven material**
- **The gowns must have long sleeves with cuffs (or elastic) at the wrists**
- **There should be a 2-inch slit made in the cuff to slide the thumb through before gloves are donned**
- **The gowns should tie in the back, so they don't have to be lifted over the head.**
- **The gowns should be mid-thigh length or fall just below the knee.**
- **The gowns should be labeled as S, M, L, or XL so the size is easily identifiable after being laundered.**

\*\*\* These gowns can be made from new fitted bed sheets using the elastic edge as the sleeve cuffs, if you do not have ribbing material or elastic for the cuffs.

Finished gowns can be dropped off 7 days a week between the hours of 8am-5pm at the UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Oakland main entrance, located at 747 52nd Street, Oakland CA 94609.
